

The CRHA aims to expand membership and forge alliances across the globe so that re-imagining humanitarian action is at the heart of every institution that undertakes humanitarian interventions.



As a locally led, locally- owned movement, the CRHA aims to:

- Collaboratively establish and operationalize an action research hub that promotes utilization of locally generated evidence to influence policy, practice and future research within the Eastern and Southern Africa region.
- Align with the ongoing agenda of localization by operationalizing the principles of locally led humanitarian and development actions
- ▶ Increase the effectiveness of localization of humanitarian action across the globe by making it more evidence and context based through action research.
- Promote evidence-based advocacy for policy and practices changes.
- ▶ Enhance capacity sharing and learning among CRHA partners on locally led humanitarian and development actions; action research and utilization of evidence to influence policy and practice.
- Utilize action research to improve humanitarian policies and practices among CRHA member organizations and beyond





The CRHA members form the assembly that meets annually to deliberate on all consortium issues. The steering committee provides overall leadership on the consortium issues raised by the general assembly.

The African Institute for Child Studies (AICS) serves as the CRHA secretariat providing coordination to the technical working groups. There are four technical working groups representing the pillars of the CRHA. These TWGs meet quarterly to discuss the implementation of the designate work plans.
